#### BLACK RIVER MEATS BEEF (NER)

 Production changes take place this week and we will now be receiving our entire beef deliveries on Tuesday going forward. We have increased head from previous weeks and should have good supply on some of the cuts that we have seen shorts on in the recent few weeks.

#### **BEEF SHORT RIB BRAISED**

 #TF116 – This is a 72-hour braised short rib that is frozen in 7 bags that weigh roughly 2# each. They can be heated up either through sous vide or in the oven in under 50 minutes from a frozen state.

#### MOZZARELLA LOAF

- We are switching brands.

#### **CREAM CHEESE 10x3#**

## PRODUCE

#### APPLES

• Possible to see some gapping on the New York honey crisp within the next few weeks as the storage crops are all most out. We will then move out to Washington.

#### ASPARAGUS

- Market remains unchanged.
- Strong supply coming out Mexico.
- Quality is excellent in conventional and organic.

#### AVOCADOES

- Equal Exchange organic avocadoes are back with normal yields and should be stable until May.
- Conventional avocadoes are remaining fairly flat over all.

#### **BLACKBERRIES CV/OG**

- Expect decent supply for the coming weeks barring any weather issues in growing areas.
- Quality has improved on both.

#### **BLUEBERRIES CV**

- Good supply on blueberries.
- Mexico remains strong.
- Production is ramping up out of Florida and California.



#### CAULIFLOWER CV/OG

- Production out of Yuma is on the decline.
- California production is forecasted to be light for this week. Expec to see market strengthen.

#### CELERY CV/OG

• Good supply and quality expected through the week.

#### CUCUMBERS

• We will see further price escalations on cucumbers as poor arrivals from Honduras and Mexico have put extra pressure on the domestic market.

#### FLORAL

• Easter floral pre-order forms are due Wednesday 3/20/24. Lock in pricing and quantities.

#### LETTUCE CV/OG

- West Coast growers are starting to prepare for the transition out of the desert to northern growing regions. Some suppliers will be starting up in Salinas in the first week of April while others will remain in Yuma until mid-April.
- Growers continue to struggle with quality issues in the field.

- Processors will start to eat up acreage to stay ahead of production delays during the move north. These factors have driven pricing up quickly this past week.
- Market will be volatile into April.

#### LEMONS CV/OG

• Market expected to remain steady over coming weeks with excellent quality.

#### LIMES

- Light demand continues to drive the ship.
- Inflated pricing has once again come off and may be the trend for the next couple weeks.
- Current harvest is trending heavy on small fruit.

#### ORANGES CV/OG

- Supply remains very tight on 88ct and smaller.
- Quality is holding steady with good brix and color.
- First load of Pixie Tangerines landed last week. Good color, great flavor.

#### ONIONS

- Starting to see some smaller sheds in the Northwest start to finish up with their storage crop.
- Expect to be able to stay with our Idaho onion crop until April. Then we might transition down to Texas which is scheduled to start in mid-March.

#### Peppers

- Seeing a pricing increase on most pepper lines. Pressure from El Nino is still impacting volume.
- Red bushels peppers are seeing some of the higher price increases.

#### POTATOES (IDAHO)

- We are into the new Peak codes.
- Larger 40/50ct potatoes are becoming a bit tight so pricing is slightly elevated.
- Smaller counts are strong and plentiful.

#### **RASPBERRIES CV/OG**

- Market should remain steady at current levels.
- Quality has been good..

#### SCALLIONS

Market remains unchanged. Quality is improving week over week with improved weather in growing areas.

#### SPRING VEG

 English Peas #NW712 and Fava Beans #H1160; Starting to see light supply popping up in the market. Both are lateline items.



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#### STRAWBERRIES CV/OG

- With improved production in California and continued strong volumes out of Mexico, we can expect good supply for the next couple weeks.
- Florida also contributing good volume, although season is on the tail end.
- Expect aggressive pricing to continue this week.

#### TENDER LEAF ITEMS

- Quality has improved greatly this week on arugula. Mesclun and Arcadian
- Spring Mix were mostly fair to poor this past week.
  Spinach improved but still seeing occasional minor decay and yellowing.

#### TOMATOES


 Still seeing supply issues in Florida and Mexico. Mexico is slowly picking up but not enough to turn the market lower yet. Grape and cherry tomato pints are also still tight, and pricing is elevated.

#### WATERMELONS

- Starting to see gapping on watermelons.
- Market should be filling back up in two weeks once Florida starts with their crop..







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
